

he Historic Town of Gold Hill

Park invite you to step back in time and experience the simple life in a 19th century gold mining village. The wood sidewalks are reminiscent of the Old West. In fact, Gold Hill, NC was a well established gold mining boom town by the early 1840's, almost a decade before the gold strike at Sutter's Mill in California. With a bustling Main Street that spanned a mile in it's heyday, Gold Hill boasted at least twenty-six merchants, twenty -three saloons, a thirty room hotel and a two story mining office. It was a town of which the then mayor of Charlotte was envious, making news headlines when boasting that he had hopes that "Charlotte will one day be as big and prosperous as Gold Hill".

The first gold discovery at Gold Hill was in 1824, but the town wasn't incorporated until 1843. A town meeting was held and Col George Bernhardt was named the first Mayor. The Barnhardt Mine at 435ft and the Randolph Mine at 850ft became the deepest and richest mines east of the Mississippi. Both mines along with the Miller Mine are key attractions at Gold Hill Mines Historic Park. Other sites in the park include an original 19th century Chilean Ore Mill, the 1845 Gold Hill Jail and Powder House (dynamite and blasting powder storage bunker). The Gold Hill Rail Trail and adjoining hiking trails offers these and more historic sites throughout the park. The park and hiking trails are open during daylight hours. Trail Brochures are available at the Montgomery General Store in the village or download from the website.

Hiking Tips


Dress for comfort and wear tennis shoes or hiking shoes. A walking stick will be an added advantage in some areas.

Trail Guide Booklet




Pick up the Trail Guide at the E.H. Montgomery General Store. It will be a valuable tool to ensure an enjoyable hike.


